What We Learned

Ash Class

This half term has flown by, and the children have thoroughly enjoyed being scientists! We have been learning about what seeds need to grow healthily and the changes that occur over time. Exploring different offcuts and seeds from fruits and vegetables has engaged and excited us all.

We have also been learning poems and singing a variety of songs, which the children have loved. After the Easter break, we will continue our 'Let's Go Outside' theme, focusing on life cycles, minibeasts, and continuing to grow and care for our plants.

Spring Term has been fantastic, especially with our Surprise Reader. The children look forward to it each week, and it has been wonderful to hear a range of stories shared by different guests. In writing, we have shown great perseverance, using and applying our phonics knowledge. The children are now beginning to write more than one sentence during shared writing and in Drawing Club. In maths, we have explored sorting, doubles, odd and even numbers, and have started writing number sentences using addition and subtraction symbols.

In RE, we discussed why Christians place a cross in their garden at Easter. We learned that the cross is an important symbol for Christians and helps them to remember Jesus.

We hope you all have a wonderful and restful Easter, full of special moments, chocolate treats, and time spent with loved ones.

Spring 2 has been very busy! The children have all worked incredibly hard and it has been lovely to see the children encourage one another in our endeavors.


