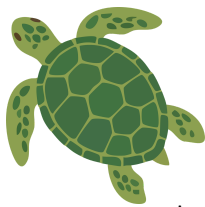
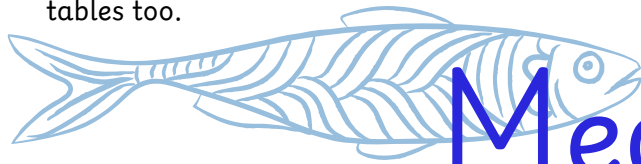


Maths

We will be looking at castles and life in the medieval times, comparing then to now. We will then explore the oceans and sea life finishing off with recycling plastics to help save the sea life.

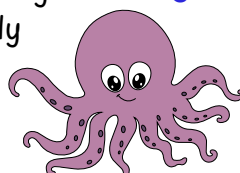
Religious Education
